## NOTES ON VARIOUS PROTOCOLS

### Evacuation Plan:

We had our first fire drill this morning. The state requires that we do one once a month. When the students leave the building, they will cross the parking lot and stand within the white fence that marks the lamp post (this is the same location that is the nursery emergency location). In the event that we must really evacuate the building, you will be contacted and asked to pick up your child at this rally point.

### Inclement Weather:

In the event of inclement weather, as a general rule we will follow the lead of the Alamance Burlington School System. In any case, feel free to exercise your own good judgment regarding the safety of travel to school.

### Sickness:

Runny noses have already arrived. Please remind your child to cover and blow at appropriate times and wash hands frequently. We have tissue and **Germ-Ex** and will do our best to prevent the spread of sickness. With that said, please keep your child at home for at least 24 hours from the last sign of a raised temperature or vomiting incident. Be assured that your child will be given every opportunity to catch up when he returns to school.
