

HISTORY AND SCIENCE

Language Arts:

- 2nd - This week we continued reading the novel *Little House in the Big Woods*. We also looked at "Ghost" digraphs, digraphs like kn and gn. Latin vocabulary is growing, so I am able to give some simple commands to the students.
- 1st - We continued vowel digraphs (ou and ow), manuscript practice, and parts of speech. We added the soft C as well.

Math:


- 2nd - We continued working with fractions. This week the students also learned to add money with a decimal, Roman numerals, and comparison word problems.
- 1st - adding two and three 2 digit numbers. We also continued to practice subtraction focusing on minus four facts.

History:

- K - We continue to discuss the Middle Ages. This week we discussed Vikings, Charlemagne, Alfred the Great, and the Holy Roman Empire.
- 1st/2nd - This week we continued talking about the civil rights movement and Martin Luther King Jr.

Science:

- 1st/2nd continues their study of birds. We have been identifying bird songs. We will be moving on to study North American Plants.
- K is looking at TREES and PLANTS!

Math:

- Divided a shape into fourths. Add 10 to a number
- Count by 10's from a single digit number

Language Arts:

- Learned hard Cc as in "cat"
- Learned that hard Cc sounds the same as the letter Kk (kangaroo)
- Practiced writing and reading words with the new letters Cc and Kk

P.E.:

- The students got more practice throwing again this week
- Learned what the trunk of your body does when you throw (it twists)

Music

- This week we talked about making homemade instruments
- We saw the difference between a finely crafted instrument and a homemade instrument
- The students made "shakers" and we were able to play the beat and melody of some songs in class

Art

- This week we talked about patterns
- Learned the difference between overall patterns (stay same size and shape) and repeated patterns (change size and shape)
- Students thought about lines, space, shape, and patterns as they worked on their patterned fish
