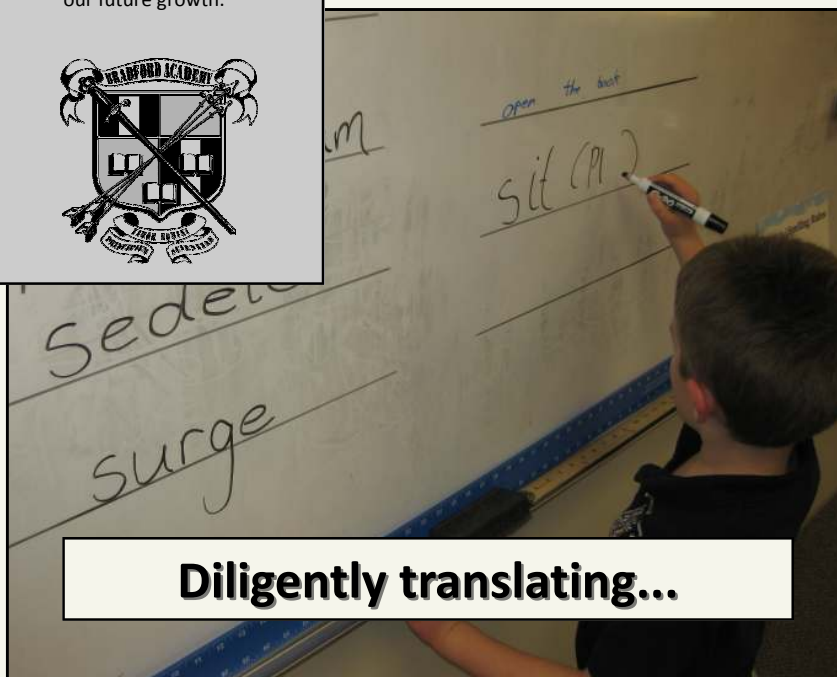


GOODBYE 2010, HELLO NEW YEAR!

 HISTORY AND SCIENCE

Language Arts:

- 2nd - Reviewed the vowel diphthongs oi/oy and ou/ow. The focused reading strategy for this week was "identifying cause and effect".
- 3rd - Students read about and summarized information about the three great Greek philosophers.

Math:

- 2nd - We're learning our multiplication facts—1's, 2's, 5's, 7's, and 10's. Also, reviewed lines of symmetry.
- 3rd-Continued reviewing multiplication facts, elapsed time and Venn diagrams.

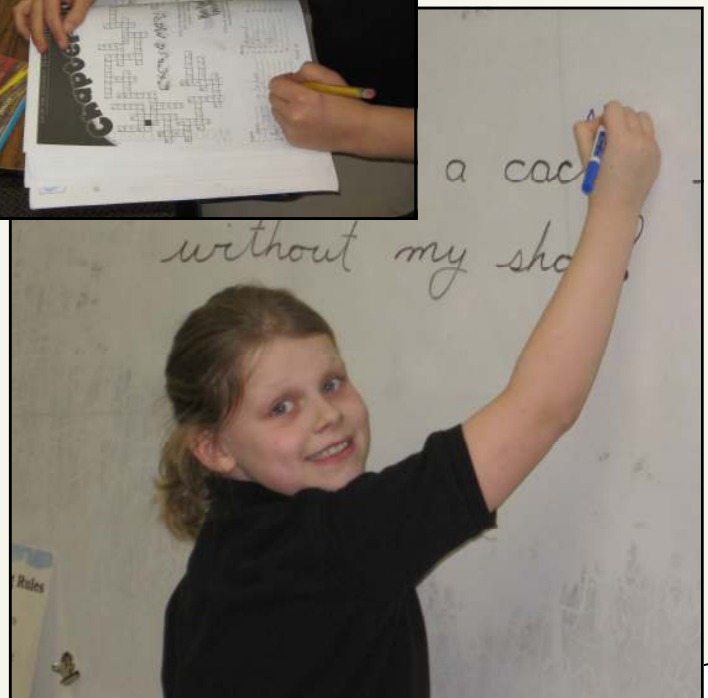
K/1st History: K will be focusing on the 1st 500 Year (of AD history) during the next 4 weeks. 1st will wrap up our look at the civil war next week.

K/1 Science: Body systems, focusing on the digestive and circulatory systems this week.

2nd/3rd History: Explored the ideas of the great Greek philosophers.

2nd/3rd Science: Sound and the ear.

2nd & 3rd Grade Latin: 2nd grade continued learning commands while 3rd learned the endings for 2nd conjugation verbs.

K/1ST & SPECIALS

K Math: Drawing a line of symmetry, identifying one half of a whole, writing $1/2$, identifying odd and even numbers, numbering a clock face, showing time to the hour, and adding 2 to an even number.

K Reading: Review of previously taught letters, alphabetical order, and review of short i and o in the middle of words. Students also learned the sound of short u as in umbrella this week.

1st Math: Identifying a. m. and p. m., noon and midnight, and dozen/half dozen. Also, adding three two-digit numbers, reading a thermometer to the nearest 2 degrees F, subtracting 2 facts, and solving a problem by guessing and checking.

1st Reading: Dropping final silent e to add -ing, final -ly, read Lexi's Hope, and two sounds of oo.

Language Arts: Initials and abbreviations in addresses, began memorizing the poem, "Mr. Nobody".

Art (2nd/3rd): The students practiced what they have been learning about shading using cross-hatching and hatching strokes.

(K/1st): Students used elements from the circle and line families to begin to draw a bird this week.

Music: (2nd/3rd): Review of quarter note, eighth note, and quarter rest.

P. E. (2nd/3rd) : Practiced backhand throw and sandwich catch in disc sport.

P. E. (K and 1st) : Practiced hopping, jumping, leaping, walking, and running.

Note: 2nd and 3rd grade may bring thin gloves to use for P. E. next week.
