

Norman Rockwell said that he was an illustrator not an artist, although he really didn't know the difference. I think he had more claim to the title artist than some of his contemporaries. Artists like Jackson Pollack and Pablo Picasso enjoyed much notoriety as artists in their day but neither captured the hearts of the common man like Rockwell. Bradford Academy was blessed this week to have the opportunity to visit the North Carolina Museum of Art to visit the Norman Rockwell exhibit. We were able to see 40 original paintings and 325 covers from the *Saturday Evening Post* (spanning 47 years). He really was a
