Language Arts:

- 2nd - *The Boxcar Children*, reading comprehension, punctuation, capitalization rules and pronouns.
- 3rd—The students continue to practice summarizing written text.

Math:

- 2nd - Practiced making change, also reviewed division by 2, 3, 5, 7 and 9.
- 3rd- Continued mixed numbers, improper fractions and probability.

K/1st History: End of the Middle Ages

2nd/3rd History: This week's topic was the destruction of Pompeii by the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius.

Latin: 3rd - direct objects and prepositions, 2nd - food words and review

Science: 2/3 continued studying Air and Water. K/1 completed their study of flowers.

K Math: Counting nickels and pennies and ordering events by time.
